

RESERVATIONS

FINAL PAYMENT

Final payment will be due February 28, 2018. Payment can be made by check, Visa, Discover, or MasterCard. PROOF OF US CITIZENSHIP, PASSPORT, VISA & MINOR CHILDREN REQUIREMENTS

Minors traveling with either one parent or no parents must have a certified letter of permission from the parent or parents who is/are not traveling. This letter must be presented at airport check-in. All international tours require a current passport. Entrance to Israel requires your passport be valid for 6 months after your return date. Your passport number must be recorded by a Pilgrim Tours agent when making your reservation. Names on airline tickets must appear as shown on passport. Photocopies are not acceptable forms of identification. Non U.S. Citizens are responsible to fulfill appropriate entry requirements of the destination countries. Contact the local Consulate of the country or countries you intend to visit for information.

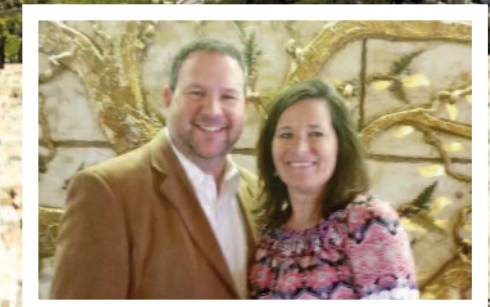

10 Day Inspirational Tour | April 29 – May 8, 2018

Day 1 – Sunday, April 29, 2018: Departure

Today we embark on our Journey to the land of Israel. Prepare yourself for a life-changing experience. Get some rest on the flight... tomorrow you will be walking where Yeshua (Jesus) walked!

Day 2 – Monday, April 30, 2018: Arrive Israel

Arrive in Israel and travel northward to our hotel for one night in the coastal area near Tel Aviv. The remainder of the day is free to walk along the Mediterranean, relax, and have dinner. The time is right for a personal devotional with the sunset over the "Great Sea." Meet your Israeli guide, enjoy a time of prayer of thanks for the special blessings ahead, for the people of the "Promised Land," and for a good nights rest.

Day 3 – Tuesday, May 1, 2018: Caesarea, Megiddo & Nazareth

After breakfast, we travel by private motor coach along the coast of the Mediterranean Sea to Caesarea, where Shimon Kefa (Peter) first shared the gospel with Gentiles, and where they were immersed. We'll see the Roman Amphitheatre, hippodrome, a film on history and the remains of this famous port city, and aqueduct, and then journey on to Mt. Carmel, where Elijah challenged King Ahab and the prophets of Baal. Visit a

Messianic Congregation and a colorful Druze village. Next we travel through the Jezreel Valley to Megiddo, the Armageddon Battlefield, where archaeologists have unearthed 20 levels of civilization. We drive through the area of Cana and Nazareth, the boyhood home of Yeshua (Jesus), where we visit the Nazareth Village - a wonderful recreation of Biblical times with costumed guides. We will have dinner and overnight lodging for the next two nights in the Tiberias area on the Sea of Galilee.

Day 4 – Wednesday, May 2, 2018: Magdala, Capernaum, Mount of Beatitudes, Sea of Galilee Boat Ride, Jordan River Immersion (baptism) Sites

Following breakfast, our morning travels take us to Magdala, home town of Mary Magdalene. The recent excavation of the First Century Synagogue and well preserved village makes Magdala one of the most interesting Biblical sites in Israel. Next we visit Capernaum, we will visit the ruins of an ancient synagogue and Shimon Kefa's (Peter) home. Then we travel on to the possible site of the multiplication of loaves and fishes in Bethsaida and the Mount of the Beatitudes overlooking the Sea. After viewing the ancient Fisherman Boat at an operating Kibbutz, we enjoy a relaxing cruise on the sea of Galilee with Messianic music and

dancing. We end the day with an opportunity to be immersed at the Jordan River Immersion site.

Day 5 – Thursday, May 3, 2018: Bet Shean, Bethany, Ein Gedi & Dead Sea

We begin the day as we travel southward to Beit-Shean/Scythopolis, the most magnificent archeological site in Israel, located at the strategic juncture of the Jezreel and Jordan valleys. Like Jericho, it has been almost continuously occupied throughout history. After defeating Saul and his sons on Mt. Gilboa, the Philistines hanged their bodies on the walls of Beit-Shean. During the time of Yeshua (Jesus), Scythopolis was one of the chief cities of the Decapolis - a league of ten cities sharing Greek culture and government. Following the fertile Jordan Valley southward, your guide will point out the agricultural restoration of the "Land of Milk and Honey" and Israel's intricate irrigation development. We pass ancient Jericho, viewing from a distance this city famed as the oldest in the world, before coming to the Jordan River (Qeser El Yehud), the Israeli side of Bethany Beyond the Jordan, the place where Yeshua (Jesus) was immersed, where Elijah and Elisha crossed the Jordan as well as the area where the children of Israel led by Joshua entered the Promised land. Afterwards we proceed to Ein Gedi, "Spring

of the Goat," an oasis on the western shore of the Dead Sea. Because of its warm climate and abundant supply of water, the site developed a reputation for its fragrant plants and date palm groves. This is where King David hid from Saul, and where God defeated the enemies of the Israelites by praise and worship led by King Jehoshaphat. Our lodging for the evening is at the Dead Sea – the lowest place on earth. Spend time in the spa and enjoy a relaxing float in the Dead Sea before dinner.

Day 6 – Friday, May 4, 2018: Masada, Abraham's Tent, Arrival Jerusalem, Evening Messianic Shabbat Service

Our day begins with some free time at the Dead Sea. Later this morning we will enjoy a cable car ride to the mountain top fortress of Masada. Next, we pass by the Qumran Caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered. This afternoon we go to Abrahams Tent and revisit life in the time of the Patriarchs. Here, complete with costumes, dramatic presentation, and camel rides we enjoy a delicious meal in a desert tent. Next, we go up to Jerusalem. After dinner we will have our own Messianic Shabbat Service. Our lodging for the next four nights will be in Jerusalem.

Day 7 – Saturday, May 5, 2018: Yeshua's (Jesus') Last Steps, Mt. of Olives Garden of Gethsamane, Joseph's Project, City of David

Today we walk where Yeshua (Jesus) walked, beginning the day with a panoramic view of the old city of Jerusalem from atop the Mt. of Olives, the site where Yeshua (Jesus) will return. Then on to the Garden of Gethsemane. How many have wished to be whisked back in time to get a glimpse of our

Lord or hear His voice if only for a moment? Walking between the ancient olive trees, read Yeshua's (Jesus') prayer and take time for personal reflection. Next we plan to visit the Joseph Project of the MJAA. This is the largest humanitarian distribution center and network in Israel. We will participate in a service project for the people of Israel. We continue our sightseeing just outside the Dung Gate on the southeastern hill below the Temple Mount in the City of David. It was during the time of Solomon that the city limits extended past this part of Jerusalem. We visit Gihon Springs, the original water source for Jerusalem, view new excavations including a typical Israelite four-room house, and the lower city wall. A highlight today will be a water walk through the incredible Hezekiah's Tunnel to the pool of Siloam, the place of Yeshua's (Jesus') miracle in John 9.

Day 8 – Sunday, May 6, 2018: Western Wall, Rabbinical Tunnels, Holocaust Museum, King of Kings Synagogue

This morning, on our way into the city we will pray at the Western ("wailing") Wall, the last remaining wall of the Second Jewish Temple. We will walk through fascinating rabbinical tunnels giving us clear understanding of the amazing construction of the Temple Mount. This afternoon we visit Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Memorial. This is a place both of great sorrow and an experience of hope and triumph for those who trust in Messiah. In the early evening we will attend services at the King of Kings Messianic Synagogue.

Day 9 – Monday, May 7, 2018: Israel Museum, Garden Tomb, Cardo Shopping, Shopping Ben Yehuda Street

Today an interesting and educational time

awaits us at the Israeli Museum. Walk through collections of centuries-old Israeli artifacts including the Dead Sea Scrolls, and then a guided walk through an accurately detailed model of Biblical Jerusalem will help to prepare you for what you will experience in the following days. The climax of our day is the area of Golgotha ("place of the skull") and the Garden Tomb, where we celebrate Yeshua's Resurrection with Zikaron/ Communion and a time of praise. This afternoon we can walk the Cardo, the ancient main street of the Old City once lined with shops, now partially restored. Our last stop we will have time to visit the pedestrian malls of Ben Yehuda Street. We have our final dinner this evening at the hotel.

Day 10 – Tuesday, May 8, 2018: Home

A very early morning departure for the Tel Aviv Airport for our flight homeward will allow for arrival home by early afternoon.
